### **March 31: Kick off with Baron Wormser**

The Kellogg-Hubbard Library hosts POETRY Alive! 2011's kick-off party featuring poet Baron Wormser, reading from his new book, *Impenitent Notes*. Wormser is former Poet Laureate of Maine. **7 p.m.**

### **April 1<sup>st</sup> through 30<sup>th</sup>: POETRY Alive! 2011 Poetry Display.**

A text display throughout downtown Montpelier occurs during National Poetry Month (April). Over 170 Vermont poets of all backgrounds and ambitions are represented in this self-guided, walkable anthology of contemporary Vermont poetry. Features include The Budding Poet's Garden, Poetry of 1911, Poetic Legacies and "Guy-ku," a poetry StoryWalk™. Pick up a guide at participating locations. (Various venues in Montpelier)

### **April 5: Open Poetry Reading**

Bear Pond Books hosts its annual
